

## Procedure for Gaining Access to College of Nursing Research Laboratory:

To complete the training you will need to have a CatCard, NetID and password, and UAccess. Training can be found at:

\*Note: Only required if you have taken the General Laboratory Chemical Safety Training before April 1st, 2013. The current version of Chemical training includes sufficient information on GHS to satisfy the OSHA training requirements.

### Bloodborne Pathogens Training

1. Go to Risk Management at <http://risk.arizona.edu/>
2. Select *Safety Training* in "Quick Links"
3. Select *Bloodborne Pathogens* training.
4. Watch the BP Enrollment Tutorial Video. Once enrolled you have 30 days to complete the course. You will get annual reminders to update the training.

After completing these courses, the PI that you are working under, or the College of Nursing Approval Safety Coordinator can request worker status for you in the Laboratory under a specific Approval (researcher). **An official UA email address is required for this registration.** You will then receive notification from RLSS that you are in compliance. ### CITI Program Training: Protecting Human Research Subjects

University of Arizona research faculty, staff, advisors and students must complete the University of Arizona human subject's component of the [Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative \(CITI\) online training program](#). Specific modules to be completed are the Basic Course for Biomedical Research Investigator or Social & Behavioral Investigator (the Native American module is required for UA research), and any Refresher courses as indicated. If you have certification from another institution, enter the UA as a learner institution and any additional required courses should show up. The CITI certification is **valid for a four-year period**, after which time refresher training must be completed. It is recommended that a copy of the completion certificate is available to your PI.

**Upon completion of all training, hard copies of all certificates should be on file in the laboratory. Keycard access to the lab will then be requested for you if necessary!**
