Program Notes

The following are important notes about the Doctor of Nursing Practice Program for all students:

- Nurse Faculty Loan Recipients: NFLP recipients should take NURS 602 (Academic Faculty Role: Theory and Application) as a 3 credit elective course. NFLP recipients are also required to take NURS 694 (Teaching Practicum) for 1-6 units. Students will work with the faculty advisor to determine how many units are appropriate relative to the student's prior experience.
- RHPP Scholars: 3 rural focused courses are required for RHPP Scholars. A minimum of 1 rural course must be selected from 773, 774, and/or 638
- Course Availability: Courses are typically taught once per year and must be taken in the order listed.
- Summer Courses: Courses offered during the summer term may be offered between variable dates. Students are encouraged to
 review all courses in the University's official schedule for accurate start and end dates. Students may also review the University's
 official calendar for additional information.
- **Program Milestones:** A complete checklist of all program milestones, including instructions, is available to current students and faculty via Doctoral Commons (University of Arizona D2L).
- Resident Intensive Summer Experience (RISE): BSN to DNP students are required to attend the RISE experience at least twice during
 the program. Students choosing a part-time plan of study should work with the faculty advisor to determine when the student should
 attend RISE.
- Clinical Skills Intensive (CSI): Students are required to attend the CSI experience once during Spring Term 2 when Clinical Management courses begin.
