



Nursing Education (NE) Graduate Certificate – Fall Start

The Graduate Certificate in Nursing Education provides nurses with an advanced degree (MSN, DNP, or PhD) to develop a skill set to prepare them to teach nurses across all levels of practice in academic and clinical practice settings. The courses in the certificate program provide a foundation for certification as a Certified Nurse Educator and practical teaching experiences with expert faculty mentors. Students have the opportunity to explore the role of the nurse educator, course and program development (both in-person and online), best practices in student assessment and overall program assessment.
